All application materials must be submitted in English.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

All Applicants Must:

- Be currently enrolled, and enrolled for the entire 2012-2013 academic year, in a graduate or undergraduate program in an instrumentation, systems, or automation discipline (2 year program or 4 year baccalaureate program or its equivalent) at an educational institution in their country of residence.
- Two year program applicants must have completed at least one academic semester or 12 semester hours or its equivalent.
- Four year degree program applicants must be in their sophomore year or higher of their study or its equivalent at the time of application.
- Applicants must be full-time students in an educational institution and have at least an overall GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale or equivalent.
- Preference for Foundation scholarship awards is given to students who are enrolled in a degree program in instrumentation, systems, and automation or other closely related fields.
- Applicants are eligible to apply and win in multiple years if the applicant meets ISA's requirements for reporting back to ISA on the use of previously granted awards and if the application demonstrates additional potential contribution to the field beyond that for which any previous awards were based.
- Application must be postmarked no later than 15 February 2012. However, the application must be received at ISA by 25 February 2012 to be eligible.
- Submit one original of all application documentation and ten (10) copies, with each copy stapled individually. (Do not paperclip).

REFERENCE LETTERS

Two letters of recommendation are required. At least one of the letters should be from a faculty member who is familiar with your educational program. Faculty recommendations must be on university letterhead and should be specific to the applicant (no 'form letters'). The references should comment on your character and potential for leadership, and for making a significant contribution to an instrumentation, systems, and automation profession. This can be based upon specific examples drawn from your course work, projects, or activities. A confidential recommendation is not required. Each letter of recommendation must be signed by the person making the recommendation. Place one copy of the reference letter in each set of documents that make up the complete application, unless provided in confidence.

NOTE: If the person providing the letter wishes to write a confidential reference, he or she should place the original letter plus nine copies in a sealed envelope. Include that envelope in your application package.

- On a separate sheet of paper, succinctly describe your ambitions and qualifications as an innovator or future leader in a career in instrumentation, systems, or automation. Describe your career objectives and how the award of an ISA scholarship would help you attain your objectives. Explain why you want to enter the field of automation. Comment about what you have achieved and learned through your studies and activities, and what this indicates about your character and determination. Your essay should not exceed 400 words and should be typed, double-spaced.
- Essays should not discuss financial need or personal information.

2. Employment Record / Work Experience

- List all jobs you have held. Include the names of the employers, the dates of employment, and the type of work you performed.
